Call for entries

£600 Prize

Since their launch in 2007, the Urban Design Awards have considered over 400 submissions highlighting some of the best urban design work being undertaken throughout the UK and abroad, from completed schemes to design guidance, masterplanning studies, student work and publishing.

We are calling for 2019 entries in the category of **Student Project**. This award seeks to give recognition to the best, most interesting student project work and highlight current practice in urban design education.

The winners will receive the Francis Tibbalds Trust fund's £600 prize, to be awarded in March 2019.

Eligibility

The award is open to both individuals and groups of students in full or part-time education and up to 12 months post-graduation as at 1 March 2019.

Entrants must be either

- students with UDG membership studying at a UK university or
- students enrolled on a course at a UDG member university: <http://www.udg.org.uk/universities>

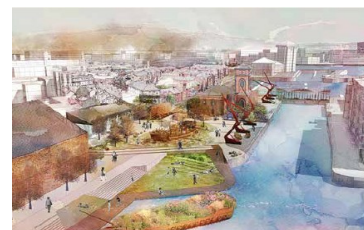
Entries will be accepted from others providing they first join the Urban Design Group - please see joining details on UDG website: <http://www.udg.org.uk/join>

Both UK and international students may enter providing they are enrolled on a UK course; unfortunately entries will not be accepted from those studying at non-UK institutions.

Submissions are not confined to urban design courses but the criteria (outlined below) must be met:

Projects must relate to the current and/or immediately completed academic year.

Different kinds of course work will be eligible but design must be the focus of the entry.



Judging Criteria

- Shortlisting will be based on both the merits of the project itself and the success with which it is communicated as a publishable article for the journal.
- **Above all, your submission should provide a clear explanation of why the project is an example of good urban design, supported by evidence.**
- Entrants should also pay close attention to the following guidelines when preparing their entry:

1.	Urban design objectives & analysis	Concise explanation of the urban design objectives, and design criteria, informed by analysis and response to context (social, economic, environmental).
2.	Quality of urban design	Show how the project represents good urban design practice.
3.	Presentation	Images and drawings should be of appropriate quality, be relevant to the project, and illustrate the overall concept and spatial aspects of the scheme, development over time, including 3D images or photographs of models. Images and text should be clearly cross-referenced.
4.	Clarity of communication	Clear writing style with minimal use of jargon.
5.	Lessons learned	Relevant and succinct conclusions which suggest what you learned (positive or negative) from the design process.

Group Work

A great deal of work in urban design is carried out in groups in urban design coursework. The UDG is happy to make the award to either an individual or to a group (as defined in the entry) but entrants should note that the UDG is only able to subsidise travel for one representative to the Awards Event

Deadline for submission: 5pm on 25 September 2018

Entry Format

- Two A4 pages
- Maximum 1000 words of text
- 5 images
- Follow layout principles below:



- All margins 15mm
- Each page 3 columns with 5mm gap
- High resolution images (min 180mm width at 300dpi)
- Times New Roman 9.5pt, line spacing 11pt
- Text and image area (excluding header & captions) 56mm from top
